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IMPORTANT! Read carefully and keep instructions for future reference.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE:




To use, position the Sink Bather in sink with the mesh panel on the bottom for drainage. Place baby on bather with baby's bottom in the mesh area and head on the tail as shown.

NOTE: This product is not self-supporting in the sink or bath tub – parent must support baby at all times.

MAINTENANCE:

After each use, hang on towel bar or shower rod to dry.



CLEANING AND CARE:

Machine wash cold, gentle cycle. No bleach. Tumble dry low. Do not iron. Do not dry clean.

MARNING:

Not a safety device.

DROWNING HAZARD: Babies have drowned while using infant bathers and bath aid products.

- STAY in arm's reach of your baby.
- Use **ONLY** in empty adult tub or sink.
- Keep drain open in adult tub or sink.
- Never rely on a toddler or preschooler to help your baby or alert you to trouble. Babies have drowned even with other children in or near bath tub. DO NOT allow other children (even older) to substitute for an adult.
- Children can drown in as little as 2 cm of water in a very short time.
- Always remain in contact with your child during bathing.
- Never leave your baby unattended in the bath, even for a few moments. If you need to leave the room, take the baby with you.

FALL HAZARD: Babies have suffered head injuries falling from infant bathers.

- Place bather **ONLY** in adult tub, in or next to sink.
- **NEVER** lift or carry baby in the product.
- **STOP** using product when baby starts trying to sit up or has reached 20 lb, whichever comes first.
- STAY in arm's reach of your baby.
- Never leave child unattended. The infant must NOT be left in the product without an adult caregiver in attendance.
- Discontinue the use of the product if it becomes damaged, broken, or disassembled.
- Test the temperature of the water in, or being put into, the product prior to placing the infant into the product.
- The typical water temperature for bathing a baby should be between 90 and 100°F (32.2 and 37.8°C).
- To avoid scalding by hot water, position the product in such a way to prevent your child from reaching the source of water.
- Check the stability of the product before use.
- Do not use replacement parts other than those approved by the manufacturer or distributor.
